Anna is heavily involved with the local brass band community, a community of its own within the St Austell area, and Cornwall as a whole. Over the years, numerous Poltair students have joined various local brass bands, and we are delighted to be offering brass lessons with Anna as part of our peripatetic lesson provision.

We are in the process of appointing a second guitar teacher, due to the large number of students wishing to take up the instrument. We are also thrilled to again be offering violin tuition here at Poltair, in addition to the very popular piano and drum kit lessons on offer.
