Badminton Success for Bridget



Back in May, the Cornwall Badminton County Championships took place. Invites were sent out to clubs, schools and county players - there was a great turn out of some of Cornwall's finest badminton players.

Year 9 student, Bridget, played in the U17 category during the first tournament weekend, entering all three disciplines: singles, ladies' doubles and mixed doubles!

In the singles, she had to compete against some very strong girls and, as it was an U17 event, she was competing against girls with some two years' more experience and strength than her. However, without conceding a single game, Bridget came out on top and won the category!

In both the doubles and the mixed doubles' tournaments, Bridget and her respective partners, came up against some very experienced partnerships...

Having won all their matches, Bridget and her mixed doubles' partner made it through to what turned out to be a nail-biting final, playing against a pair of very experienced 16-year-olds. This match came down to the very last point, but we are delighted to say that Bridget and her partner were triumphant!

In the ladies' doubles, Bridget and her partner didn't lose a single match, despite playing against some very experienced partnerships, and were therefore victorious in that category as well!

The following weekend, Bridget took part in the U15 tournament. Success once again in both the singles and the ladies' doubles – again with no games conceded! Bridget had not intended to take part in the mixed doubles, however, on the day of the tournament, she was approached by the Referees and asked whether she would partner an inexperienced boy who had not managed to secure a partner for the tournament. On a high from her wins in the two earlier disciplines, Bridget accepted the challenge, and they romped home with a tournament win – again with no games conceded!

Bridget received gold medals for all six wins (the only player to achieve a clean sweep), and at the June presentation evening the relevant cups were awarded. She now has her sights set on the U21 Cornwall County Championship, to be held in December. This will be quite a challenge for her, competing against adults with a lot more strength and experience, but she is undaunted and will give it her best shot - despite being only 14 years old!

We can't wait to follow Bridget's sporting journey, there is no doubt lots more to come from this talented young lady. From all of us here at Poltair, WELL DONE!

Every Monday afternoon, Poltair hosts a different sporting festival for our Partnership Primary schools - Mount Charles, Bishop Bronescombe, St Mewan, Sandy Hill, Charlestown, Pondhu, Mevagissey, St Stephen Churchtown, Luxulyan and Treverbyn. Examples of festivals we have run this term include:

Rounders Festival

Over 30 children competed against other schools and learnt to play different types of rounders, one of which being "kick rounders".


